forever, Amen.

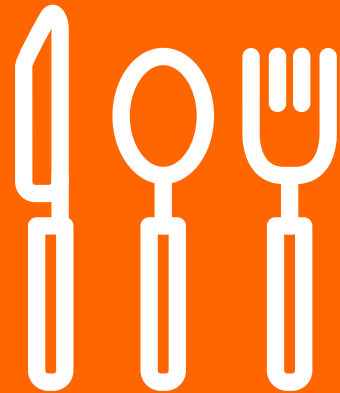
opening prayer

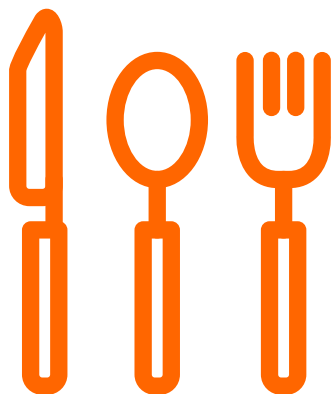
Litany of Thanksgiving
